ORDINANCE NO. 2025 - 002

Ordinance relating to the emergency telephone service charge on **wireless** service charge collections.

AN ORDINANCE RELATIVE to LA. R.S. 33:9101 ET SEQ. AS AMENDED BY THE LOUISIANA LEGISLATURE, UPDATING THE EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SERVICE CHARGE ON WIRELESS CMRS CONNECTION AS DEFINED IN 47 CFR 9.3, TO COLLECT THE AMOUNT OF SAID SERVICE CHARGE TO BE LEVIED WITHIN THE JURISDICTION OF THE DISTRICT, TO PROVIDE FOR RELATED MATTERS, AND TO OTHERWISE PROVIDE WITH RESPECT THERETO

WHEREAS, during the 1999 Session of the Louisiana Legislature, Act 1029 was enacted, which allowed the Parish Communications District (District) to establish/increase by resolution or ordinance of the Board a service fee on wireless services; and

WHEREAS, during the regular session of the Rapides Parish Board of Commissioners, September 9, 1999, in accordance with Act 1029 (1999), the service charge of \$.85 was levied.

WHEREAS, through the enactment of Act Number 665 of 2016 (Regular Session) the state of Louisiana has authorized the various communications districts of the state, including the District, to increase the said CMRS emergency telephone charge from to an amount not to exceed one dollar and twenty-five cents (\$1.25) per month per wireless CMRS connection-as defined in 47 CFR 9.3.; and

WHEREAS, through the enactment of the said Act Number 665 of 2016 (Regular Session) the State of Louisiana has found that it is in the public interest for 9-1-1 systems operated by the communications districts within Louisiana to provide Next Generation 9-1-1 (NG911) service to the public when the necessary technological requirements can be met and sufficient funding to make these improvements becomes available; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Ordinance is to provide additional funding for NG911, E9-1-1, 9-1-1 call taking, dispatch, telecommunication systems for notification of first responders and for other lawful purposes of the District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE RAPIDES PARISH COMMUNICATIONS DISTRICT THAT:

SECTION 1: Definitions:

- a. "CMRS" means commercial mobile radio service as defined by 47 C.F.R. 20.3.
- b. "CMRS Connection" means each device telephone number assigned to a CMRS customer.

- c. "Service Charge" means the CMRS emergency telephone service charge as defined in the said Act Number 665 of 2016 (Regular Session) and as levied and collected pursuant to this Ordinance.
- d. "E9-1-1" means an emergency telephone system, which provides the caller with emergency 9-1-1 system service, that directs 9-1-1 calls to appropriate public safety answering points by selective routing based on the geographical location from which the call originated, and that provides the capability for automatic number identification and other features that the Federal Communications Commission may require in the future.

SECTION 2: There is hereby levied a CMRS emergency telephone service charge of one dollar and twenty-five cents (\$1.25) on each CMRS as described in LA R.S. 33:9109(C)(4) and shall be levied for each connection that has a billing address within the District.

SECTION 3: The said CMRS emergency telephone service charge shall be collected from service users unless otherwise exempt from taxation, and the avails of said emergency telephone service charge shall be expended as authorized by Part I of Chapter 31 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes.

SECTION 4: All ordinances and resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5: If any provision or item of this ordinance or the application thereof is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions, items or applications which can be given effect without the invalid provisions, items or applications, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared severable.

SECTION 6: The effective date of this ordinance is October 1, 2025.
